Whiskey Warmth

I remember how Whiskey traveled. It descended a warm path lined with the fiery Red and Gold tones of autumn, consoling my mind as it traversed. It spread and engorged my body until I felt a dense sort of buoyancy... as though I were submerged in a vat of warm oatmeal.

I felt... held.

There was safety in that feeling and I would find any opportunity to reach it. It was not long until that magical sensation would beat its own time to my toes. I felt aglow at the site of the bottle, warm rush of adrenaline as it lifted, and the heat of submersion upon the drink's initial descent.

And so it was. The journey whiskey took helped me feel normal, and to manage. It provided relief and comfort. But the serenity I found in the bottle turned out to be an empty, hollow lie.

To chase that feeling I had to crawl inside myself and when it seemed I had found it, there was never any place to go but down. There was no sharing it from the bottom of myself and it was never enough to fill me completely, so I'd need another chaser.

That was then, and this is now.

Now the leaves of autumn give me warmth. The rich and brilliant colors fill me with more peace and authentic joy than I know what to do with. Like the branches that hold these leaves, this feeling travels up and out. It spreads out from there, and back to fill me up some more. The authenticity lies in the raw honesty of the feelings. They are at times, if not often, tinged with some bittersweet. The leaves co-exist, bright with dark. They stand out in raw beauty and then fall (though they glide) and dry up. But the cycle of phenomenon is honest.

Not so the phenomenon of feelings that leads to the lie of drink. These are the dishonest feelings that cannot tolerate opposition or difference. They tell you things like, "I am relieved...safe...happy," but soon get bored and run out on you. And the chase is on, for another cover of the truth. The honest feeling-as-verb, rather than noun, I experience when I see these trees never begs chase.

And so it goes. Whisky warmth doesn't hold a candle to the heat of this tree, for me. And the lie would be that a leaf is not capable of holding a person... ~ Kim

Imagine: car doesn't start, 2 ladies pushing the truck out of the garage, jumper cables touching and smoke coming out of the hood of the truck, clipped my Sponsee's truck with mine as we pushed it out of the garage, clipped my truck with my golf cart while putting it away, and driving all the way to Marco expecting battery to recharge itself and it did not!

My past self would have been a hot mess. However, today as a recovering alcoholic, I do not have to freak out in situations like these, I can pause, pray, and proceed. What a truly wonderful gift!

When we got to the beach and my truck was dead again, I suggested that we leave it, go enjoy our day, and do what we came to do, it'll be there when we get back. After a wonderful day on the beach, my Sponsee suggested maybe we should pray.

Well, I did exactly that! I let God know that I CAN NOT control other people, places, or things in life, only how I react. All I asked of God was to help me to take care of the situation with the least amount of stress possible. Well, when we got back to my truck, ironically, there was a young couple parked next to me who had jumper cables and were able to get me started, and on our way. Wow! No stress here!

I also had to cancel a speaking engagement at a meeting early that evening to figure out my car problems, but you know what? Again - everything worked out and I get the opportunity to speak next week.

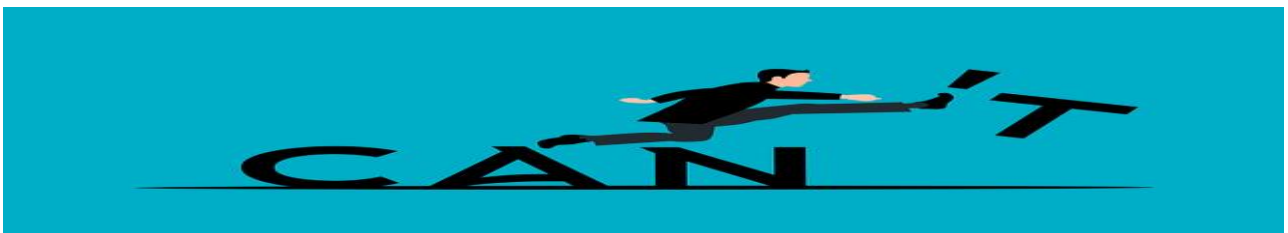

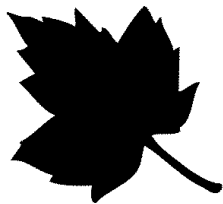
