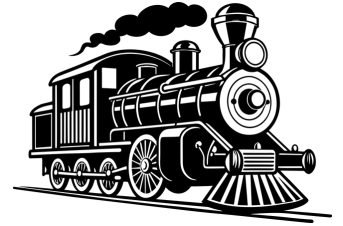

CHANGE

From Our Great Responsibility: A Selection of Bill W.'s General Service Conference Talks 1951-1970.

1960 — 25th year of the Fellowship; 22nd year of the trusteeship; 10th year of the Conference.

"We live in an era of change. Our Twelve Steps probably won't change; the Traditions, not at all likely. But our manner of communication, our manner of organizing ourselves for function, for service — let us hope that this goes on changing for the better, forever. There is a very natural resistance that we have toward change. We are apt to say, "Well, it worked very well the way it was. Why change?" But, after all, we have undertaken several tremendous changes. You will remember that in the very early days people said, "Why a self-appointed trusteeship?" Later people said, "Why a book?" And now, in 1960, many people say, "Why a Conference?" So I cite that to show that on good evidence, with the need clearly in sight, we are indeed ready to make all kinds of changes. Not that any great changes are in prospect, but I think we ought to stay open-minded on this matter of change. We reference the past and its lessons for so long as those teachings work. When they don't, we readapt and we reshift. That has been our history.

Sometimes, however, we go to the other tack, throwing out the baby with the bathwater, ignoring the lessons of the past. We might want to change, but we must also understand the past and its lessons. In connection with this service Conference, I have been trying to do a set of interpretive essays, or rather articles, and have cast up a new batch of points called "Twelve Concepts for World Service." You'll remember that our Third Legacy Manual, except for its brief historical sketch, is a manual of procedure. It tells you the *how* — how we serve as group representatives, as committeemen, as delegates, as trustees, directors, staff and so on. Now, these essays would attempt, on the basis of the lessons of the past and of our history, to show the *why* of it. How did we happen to get related together in this way, and what have been the lessons?"

NOTE: "About 50,000 copies of the Third Legacy pamphlet, which contained the proposal to form the General Service Conference, were distributed in November and December 1950."

On December 22, 2025, we received an email from the AAWS Board Chair and the GSO General Manager informing us of a price increase that will go into effect on February 1, 2026. Book prices will increase by \$3.00 and all other literature items, such as pamphlets, will increase by 15%. The only exceptions are the *Alcoholics Anonymous* Facsimile First Printing of the First Edition (no change in price) and *AA for the Older Alcoholic* (15% instead of \$3.00 increase).

I attend a weekly meeting with managers from other Intergroups and Central Offices throughout the US and Canada. We have discussed this price increase several times and shared ideas for how best to prepare our offices for the change.

Here, at Lee County Area Intergroup, we have ordered a surplus of Big Books and 12&12's in advance of the increase. By doing so, we can delay an increase in our cost and also make a little more money when the retail price increases. This "little bit extra" helps us continue our mission of helping our local Fellowship carry the message of AA beyond the groups and into our community.

Did you know?

There are a total of **217** meetings in our area (149 registered as AA groups)

Several meet more than once a week, so there are a total of **360** meetings held every week across Lee, Hendry and Glades Counties and Immokalee (327 in-person and 33 online)

In December, **21** groups and **4** meetings contributed to Intergroup and **21** total were represented^ at the monthly Intergroup Business meeting.

In 2025, contributions were received from 101 groups and 18 meetings.

In grateful celebration of their sobriety birthdays, many A.A. members contribute **one dollar or more** for each year of sobriety to the local Intergroup.

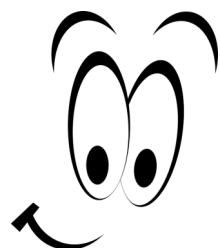

"They" turned out to be just one person.
